## IT' S TIME TO PLAY BALL!

On Monday July 25, 2005 the Lebanon Warrior Youth Football League kicked off another season of football and cheerleading in the W.O.J.F.C. Football practice began at 6:00 P.M. for all (17) Lebanon teams. At (17) teams and over (500) participants Lebanon is the second largest member organization in the W.O.J.F.C. (Centerville is the largest). Lebanon has fielded (5) bantam teams (most in the W.O.J.F.C.) and 3 teams each in 3<sup>rd</sup> grade, 4<sup>th</sup> grade, 5<sup>th</sup> grade and 6<sup>th</sup> grade. The above participant number includes nearly 130 cheerleaders. Although each team will wear the same white jersey in 2005, they will be known as Lebanon maroon, white, black, silver and gold. Each player must attend and participate in (4) non-contact conditioning practices without pads and (1) non-contact practice with full pads.

## 2005 BRINGS NEW LOOK JERSEYS

In previous seasons the Lebanon Warrior Youth Football teams were among the “best dressed” in the WOJFC. Our teams were outfitted in black helmets complete with maroon spears on each side of the helmet, maroon game pants with white piping up the side of each leg and matching maroon jerseys with white and black accents. In 2005 The Board of Directors has approved the purchase of white game jerseys with black and maroon accents. The new white jerseys are manufactured by Sports Bell.

## W.O.J.F.C. AT A GLANCE

The Western Ohio Junior Football Conference (W.O.J.F.C.) consists of 16 member organizations from the Miami Valley area and is a recreational league. The purposes of the W.O.J.F.C. are: to provide a common affiliation of Pee-Wee and Youth football organizations; foster and support safety, welfare, growth, sportsmanship, fair play and citizenship among its participants; provide a uniform code of ethics and playing rules for its members; encourage and promote the growth of and participation in Pee-Wee and/or Youth football programs; administer to the common requirements of the member organizations and teams; provide a meaningful, memorable, and rewarding experience for the children who participate under the auspices of the W.O.J.F.C.

The member organizations in 2005 are Lebanon, Centerville, Beavercreek, Northmont, Greenville, Kettering Wildcats, Kettering Firebirds, Springfield, Fairborn, Miamisburg, Xenia, Huber Heights/Wayne, Stebbins/Mad River, Meadowdale, West Carrollton, Vandalia.

As a member of the W.O.J.F.C each Lebanon team will compete in at least (10) games. There is one premiere game, (8) regular season games and a minimum of (1) tournament game. The tournament finals are played at Dayton' s Welcome Stadium.
